

DEACON'S REFLECTIONS

Three days before my 11th birthday, dad made the ultimate sacrifice for his kids. He took me, and two younger brothers, to a David Cassidy concert at Cleveland Public Auditorium. In late January of 2016, I stepped back into that venue. But on stage, instead of a pop singer, were tables with boxes of supplies. I was back to volunteer for the Homeless Stand Down. The place that gave me joy as a child was now the place where people of all faiths came together to offer help to people, some who are homeless, but most are working minimum wage, disabled or veterans.

This year, HSD is Saturday, January 20. Guests receive medical care, HIV testing, podiatry, haircuts, coats, hats, boots, a warm meal, hygiene products and more. Numerous social service agencies help people sign up for various benefits and provide info about finding work. Volunteers serve a meal, help guests find clothing and boots, work at the haircut or medical station, check in or out, and other roles. Volunteer photographers take a portrait of each guest or family who asks. Holding tight to the 8 x 10" print in its cardboard frame, guests head back out into the cold with supplies, clothes and hope.

I'll be back in January, not to relive my childhood but to hopefully live into my faith. Jesus taught us a new normal, where the powerful are humbled and the poor are lifted, fed, clothed. RECIPE CORNER

Crockpot Olive Garden Chicken

Serves: 4

Ingredients

4 boneless skinless Chicken Breasts (Thawed)

1/4 cup grated Parmesan Cheese

16 oz. Olive Garden Italian Dressing

Directions

Mix together Italian Dressing and Parmesan Cheese in medium mixing bowl, and stir well.

Place chicken in Crockpot, and pour dressing mixture over chicken. Cover Crockpot, and cook on LOW for 8 hours, or until done.



Lazy Crockpot Lasagna

Ingredients

- · 1 lb lean ground beef
- · 1 small onion, diced
- · 2 cloves garlic, minced
- · 1 1/2 teaspoons Italian seasoning
- · salt & pepper to taste
- · 1 large jar (45 oz) high quality pasta sauce
- · 4 cups mozzarella cheese
- · 1 large package (25-30 oz) cheese & spinach filled ravioli (uncooked)

Directions

- 1. Brown ground beef, onion and garlic over medium heat until no pink remains. Drain any fat.
- 2. Stir in Italian seasoning and pasta sauce. Cover and simmer 10 minutes.
- 3. Spray the inside of a 6-7 qt crock pot with cooking spray. Layer sauce, ravioli and cheese.
- 4. Repeat layers ending with cheese. Cover and cook on low 3-4 hours.

RECIPE CORNER

Slow Cooker Buffalo Chicken Chili

Ingredients:

1 pound of ground chicken

1 can white navy beans, drained and rinsed

14.5 oz can fire roasted tomatoes, drained

4 cups chicken broth

1/4 - 1/2 cup buffalo wing sauce (start with 1/4 cup and add more at end if needed)

1 package ranch dressing mix

1 cup frozen corn kernels

½ teaspoon onion powder

½ teaspoon garlic powder

½ teaspoon celery salt

½ teaspoon dried cilantro

½ teaspoon salt

8 oz cream cheese

Blue cheese crumbles (optional)

Directions:

Brown ground chicken until fully cooked, place in crock (or brown ahead of time and store in fridge until ready to assemble)

Add remaining ingredients except for cream cheese and blue cheese and give it all a stir to combine Add block of cream cheese on the top and cover

Cook on high for 4 hours or low for 8


Stir to incorporate cream cheese and add additional wing sauce as desired Top individual bowls with blue cheese crumbles if desired
