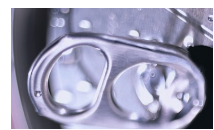

## DEACON'S REFLECTIONS

I cannot stay silent. I hear Jesus speaking out against the injustices of his day and realize that he's speaking about our day, too. I hear his words pleading for compassion and love. Our government's current policy of separating immigrant children from their parents as a way to deter more migrants is not only immoral, it is directly against Jesus' teachings. As Christians and followers of Jesus, we are called to love our neighbour, to welcome the stranger, feed the hungry; for when we do this we welcome, love and feed Jesus.

It's clear that a just society needs order and policies, but when those things exist for the sake of themselves alone and not to promote justice, then the laws need to be changed. I wonder, can we hear Jesus speaking out today for the immigrants? Yes, in each person who condemns this evil, hurtful action. Jesus speaks through those who demand compassionate treatment of the weak, lost and vulnerable.

Whatever our views on immigration – or any issue – Jesus' call to love must be our guide.

I pray that by the time you read this a new policy will be in place to protect these families who are fleeing violence and persecution. I've written multiple emails to my senators and representatives, and will continue to do so. The first email was hard; now I'm more focused and determined.

"When I was a stranger you welcomed me." It's up to us to give feet to our faith and put Jesus' words into actions for the least; to see Jesus in the stranger. The children's and parent's cries are Jesus, begging for help.

## RECIPE CORNER



### Taco Bake

**Prep Time:** 15 mins **Cook Time:** 30 mins **Total Time:** 45 mins

### Ingredients

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 packet taco seasoning water as called for on back of seasoning packet
- 3 8- inch large flour tortillas
- 1/2 cup salsa con queso
- 1 1/2-2 cups shredded Mexican cheese blend

### Instructions

1. Brown and crumble ground beef.
2. Drain excess grease.
3. Add in taco seasoning and water (following directions on back of seasoning packet).
4. Once the taco meat is ready, turn off heat and add in 1/2 cup salsa con queso.
5. Give it a good stir until thoroughly combined.
6. Preheat oven to 350F degrees.
7. Spray an 8-inch round baking pan with nonstick cooking spray.
8. Layer the bottom of the pan with a flour tortilla.
9. Now add about 1/3 of the ground beef taco filling on the the first layer.
10. Then add 1/3 of the shredded cheese.
11. Continue until you are done with all the layers: another tortilla, more taco mixture, more cheese.
12. Bake at 350F degrees for about 15-20 minutes until cheese is melted and edges are slightly golden brown.
13. Allow to cool for a couple of minutes. Slice and serve.

### Recipe Notes

Serve with sour cream and diced tomatoes on top if desired.
