What went well? What didn't go so well? What amends do I need to make? For what am I grateful?

For a while, I stopped working out. My hip began to hurt because of that, so I added this question to my nightly Examen: How was I a good steward of my body today? It has helped me do what I need to do-stretch my hip! I find it a good way to put the day to rest. Try it for yourself. May it be a helpful few minutes for you.

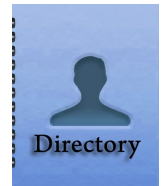
- Walk on the Towpath

DEACON'S REFLECTIONS

Jesus says, Love your neighbour, but what does that look like? Obviously, it's seen in kindness to friend and stranger. Love is seen in going out of our way to help another, to serve a meal or donate goods. At the recent General Convention, Presiding Bishop Michael Curry challenged us to broaden our view of 'loving our neighbour.' On Sunday, July 8 the Bishop and several hundred from Convention held a prayer service outside Hutto Detention Center in Texas. This Center is holding over 500 women who are seeking asylum from violence and danger in their countries. Many of them had their children taken from them by our government. Our church gathered to stand outside their current "home" in solidarity and recognition of their suffering.

In his reflection from the podium on the lawn, a stone's throw from Hutto, Bishop Curry told the crowd that, "we come in love, because we follow Jesus. And Jesus taught us love." As he listed who we should love, his momentum built: neighbours with different political views; neighbours we don't like; Muslim neighbours, immigrant neighbours, refugee neighbours. With passion in his voice he called us all to "make America great by making America good. Kind. Just and loving."

Later that day, when attendees were back in the air-conditioned convention hall, word came that the women in Hutto had been standing at the windows watching. In the video you can just make out a hand waving back. They stood there watching until the last of the dozen busses pulled away. Maybe they too were loving their neighbour.

RECIPE CORNER



CROCK POT BONELESS PORK LOIN

INGREDIENTS

- 3 lb pork loin, boneless, fat trimmed
- 2 Granny Smith apples, cored and sliced
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 tsp garlic salt
- ½ tsp crushed red peppers
- ½ cup brown sugar
- 1 tsp black pepper

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Turn crock pot to high.
2. Core and slice apples, chop onion and add to crock pot.
3. Place pork loin on top of apples and onions.
4. Add garlic salt and pepper on top and then top brown sugar. Pat in place.
5. Sprinkle crushed red peppers on top of brown sugar (gives the flavor a little kick).
6. Cover and cook on high for 5 hours.
7. After 5 hours, pop in a meat thermometer and temperature should be 160° which is perfect.
8. Spoon juices, apples and onions over the top then remove from crock pot.
9. Let rest for 15 minutes before slicing.

Baked Beans

I use Bush's Baked Beans, Original. Drain some of the liquid off. For each pound of beans, add:

At least ½ C diced onions

¼ C brown sugar

¼ C catsup

½ tsp dry mustard

Bacon for the top is optional.

Bake at 350 degrees for 2 hours, if using 2-3 # of beans.
