DEACON'S REFLECTIONS

It's unheard of for me to be ahead of a trend, so I was surprised by news I read recently. See, back in June, I was trained by NOVA and started registering people to vote. I'm concerned about those who may be forgotten or removed from the rolls. Registration is tied to your address, but if you're homeless or couch surfing until your next job, your address has changed. If you were evicted because your job doesn't pay enough for rent and food, you're no longer registered. If you're just out of prison and starting over, it's time to register. This is the population who moves often and may not know to reregister. Being in need is not synonymous with ignorance.

As I registered Tom, who uses a wheelchair, he told me he's in a better apartment; Cathy is a new voter; Mike can't remember when he last voted - they all registered.

So, how am I ahead of the trend? I read on ENS this week that Episcopalians are getting involved in voter registration. Georgia parishioners are canvassing their neighborhood in support of a statewide registration drive. The Diocese of Indianapolis hosted voter outreach events and church volunteers are part of an interfaith action to reach those who've never voted. Jesus taught by word and action that he cares deeply for the most vulnerable. Often they're the ones bearing the brunt of unjust laws and they're the ones whose voices must be heard. Join the trend - remind friends and strangers to check their registration status at 443vote.com.

RECIPE CORNER

Apple Pie Fries

Serves 8

Ingredients

- 2 tbsp butter
 - · 4 whole McIntosh apple, peeled, cored, and sliced
 - · 1/2 cup sugar
 - · 1/2 tsp cinnamon
 - · 1 tsp lemon juice
 - · 1 container (8 piece) refrigerated flaky biscuit dough

Directions

1. For the filling: Add the butter to a large saute pan and melt.

- 2. Add the apples, sugar, cinnamon, and lemon juice and cook over medium heat until the apples are soft, about 15 minutes.
- 3. Remove from the heat and cool.
- 4. When the filling is cool, roll the biscuits out on a lightly floured surface so that each biscuit forms a 7 to 8-inch circle.
- 5. Place 2 to 3 tablespoons of the filling on 1/2 of each circle. Brush the edges of the circle with water.
- 6. Fold the circle over the filling to make a half-moon shapes. Seal by pressing the edges with the tines of a fork.

Servings 8 -12

- 7. Heat a deep fryer or a deep pot halfway filled with oil to 350 degrees F.
- 8. Carefully add the pies to the oil, 1 at a time, and fry until golden brown, turning the pies as necessary for even browning, about 5 to 8 minutes.
- 9. Drain on paper towels. Sprinkle with powdered sugar immediately.

Crockpot Overnight Breakfast Casserole

Ingredients

1 30 oz package frozen shredded hash brown potatoes

- · 1/2 lb ground sausage I used Italian sausage, browned and drained
- 1 lb bacon cooked and chopped
- · 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- · 1 cup shredded mozzarella cheese
- · 1 onion diced
- 1 green pepper diced
- 1 red pepper diced
- · 12 eggs
- · 1/2 cup milk
- · 1/2 teaspoon salt
- · 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- · 1/8 teaspoon sugar

Instructions

- 1. Grease a large 6 quart slow cooker (or bigger) with cooking spray or butter.
- 2. Layer half the hash browns in the bottom of the slow cooker.
- 3. Top with half the sausage, bacon, cheese, onions, green pepper, and red pepper. Repeat layers with the remaining ingredients.
- 4. Whisk together eggs, milk, salt, pepper, and sugar.
- 5. Pour egg mixture over hash brown and cheese layers.
- 6. Cook on low for 6-8 hours on low or 4 hours on high.

Recipe Notes: Not all slow cookers cook at exactly the same temperature. You may need to adjust the cook time to your specific device to avoid burning the edges, as some readers have reported.
