(Last meeting: 3/28/19)


- 1. We discussed the booklet "What It Means to be an Episcopalian".

# **DEACON'S REFLECTIONS**

Mom & dad are downsizing and asked if I knew of a place to donate her sewing machine. I thought for a bit, then remembered - US Together. It's a non-profit providing services to refugees who've recently arrived in this country. They help with things like learning the language and getting a job; volunteers are paired up with refugees to act as mentors and give them a crash course in our culture.

When I asked US Together about the sewing machine, with it's cabinet and bench, they were delighted. It turns out that they have a client who's a seamstress and has begun to save money for a sewing machine. She plans to use her sewing skills as an additional way to support her family. The intern I spoke with said that this woman would be very happy to receive the machine, as part of her plan for self-sufficiency and contributing to her community.

So, on the day after Easter, I'll be delivering mom's sewing machine to the offices of US Together in Cleveland. It'll be sad to see it go: mom taught me to sew on it and I remember so many clothes and Halloween costumes she made us. Then I think of the woman who'll receive it, how hard it must have been to flee her home, like Jesus' parents did when he was an infant. Hopefully their new neighbours also offered help when they got to Egypt.

# RECIPE CORNER

#### **Old Fashion Hummingbird Sheet Cake**

#### **Ingredients**

- 3 cups all purpose flour
- 2 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 tbsp baking soda
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tbsp ground cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp ground nutmeg
- 4 large eggs
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup apple sauce
- 1/2 cup crush pineapple
- 3 medium bananas chopped
- 2 tsp vanilla extract

### Cream cheese frosting

- 8 oz cream cheese softened
- 4 tbsp butter unsalted
- 4 cups powdered sugar
- 2 tsp milk
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

#### **Instructions**

Preheat the oven to 325 F.

In a large bowl combine the flour, salt, baking soda, cinnamon, and nutmeg.

Mix until everything is well combined then set to the side.

In another large mixing bowl add the eggs, vegetable oil, and sugar.

Mix until well combined, then add in the apple sauce, bananas, pineapple, and vanilla. Mix.

Now slowly start adding in the flour mixture, and mix the batter until everything is well combined.

Once the batter is nice and creamy, set it to the side.

Lightly butter or oil a 9×13, then pour in the cake batter.

Place the cake in the oven and let it bake for about 1 hour and 20 minutes.

Let the cake cool until it's at room temperature.

Mix all the ingredients for the cream cheese frosting, then frost the cake.

Let the cake sit for 30 minutes before serving.
