RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS

Who was St. Timothy?

It is helpful to reflect on our "Patronal" saint—Timothy. Much of what we know about him is found in St. Paul's epistles and the Book of Acts. The epistles of First and Second Timothy are addressed to him.

Timothy was the son of a Gentile father and a Jewish mother. By the time St. Paul met Timothy, on his second missionary journey, Timothy was an active, youthful member of a Christian congregation in Lystra, which is now a part of Turkey. Paul describes Timothy as a "brother", and a servant "of the Gospel of Christ". Timothy was willing to visit places and churches on Paul's behalf. Apparently, Timothy was bashful, lacking in confidence.

The Corinthians are urged to "put him at ease". In one case, Titus replaced Timothy after a situation was not resolved favorably. Paul, also, wrote Timothy and told him to take a little wine to help his stomach ailment. The relationship between the two of them was close. While Paul was in prison awaiting his death, he requested Timothy visit him, which he did. Timothy was the first Bishop of Ephesus; he was martyred in 97 AD, possibly while protesting a celebration of the goddess Artemis.

So, our guy was multi-faceted: loyal, courageous, a good friend. He did not always succeed, but he was a devoted Christian and he was a good example. I am glad we have his name for our church.

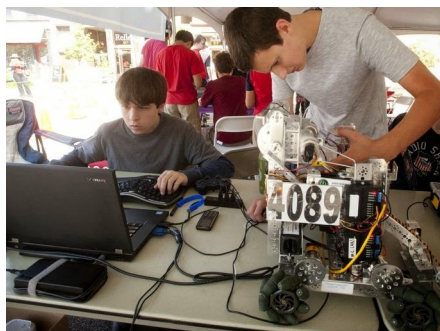
Rubber Ducks

Meals for Albert and Gay while Gay recuperates from surgery



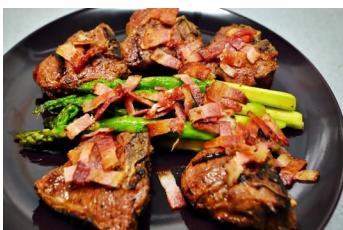

Carlos and I were at the volunteer check-in table together when he asked me to help him fill out the form. He said that he had trouble reading and writing, so I read what the form said and fill in his details. He was one of the men from Cleveland's Men's Shelter who was volunteering, alongside people from the community, to clean up the Shelter and nearby streets. Together we built picnic tables, picked up trash, planted hostas and flowers and painted the loading dock. Painting was my job, easy on the back. Thankfully, one of the guys from the shelter offered to reach the high places that I couldn't. The morning went fast, everything got done and we missed the rain! Vera brought her therapy dog, Lily, who loved the attention, I tried to teach a young volunteer how to play checkers on a floor-size board, and Leon did the grilling for our cookout lunch. Was it ever good.

I didn't really know how the day would go. But that's where faith kicks in – the faith that God will be with us in the gathering, because God is in each of the 69 volunteers and in each man at the shelter and in our working together. Have you ever tried something new, not quite knowing how it would go, and been gratefully surprised? It was a bit like that, with conversations and time to not think about which side of the building we each lived on. I'm so glad to have had the chance to spend some time with these men, many of whom are in programs at the Shelter to help them get back on their feet. The day gave us all a chance to love our neighbour.

RECIPE CORNER

Boston Cream Poke Cake: Prep time: 20 min; Cook time: 25 min

Ingredients

- 1 box yellow cake mix
- ingredients needed to make cake; eggs oil and water
- 2 3.4 oz boxes instant vanilla or French vanilla pudding
- 4 cups milk
- 1 tub chocolate frosting



Instructions

1. Make cake mix according to directions and bake in a well-greased 9 x13 pan.
2. When cake is finished, while still warm, poke holes all over cake (about 1-inch) intervals using a wooden spoon handle or other similar size object.
3. You want the holes to be fairly big so that the pudding has plenty of room to get down in there.
4. Be sure to poke right down to the bottom of the cake.
5. In a bowl, prepare pudding.
6. Whisk together instant pudding mix with 4 cups milk.
7. Whisk until all the lumps are gone.
8. Pour pudding over cake. Taking care to pour it right into the holes as much as possible.
9. Spread it all out and using the back of the spoon, gently push pudding down into the holes.
10. Put the cake into the fridge to set and cool (about 2 hours).
11. Remove the lid and foil covering from the tub of chocolate frosting.
12. Pop it in the microwave for about 10-15 seconds.
13. Stir with a spoon.
14. It should still be a little thick but pourable - not bubbly hot.
15. Pour chocolate frosting on top of pudding.
16. Spread frosting evenly over cake starting in the center then spreading it towards the sides.
17. Allow to cool on the counter for a few minutes, then put into the fridge to fully cool and set up.

Recipe Notes:

This cake needs to be kept refrigerated. This cake tastes better after it has [sat](#) in the fridge overnight.
