






DEACON'S REFLECTIONS

In early October, I attended a forum called "Lets get real about race" at the South Euclid library. It was facilitated by Erica Merritt of Equius Group. There were about 30 of us sitting in a circle and we took turns giving our name and connection to South Euclid. A nice ice-breaker question. We were young and old, black and white, some dressed in jeans, some in suits.

Erica asked us a few questions, and one or two people shared experiences with the group about encounters with a race different than theirs. Next, she handed out cards with questions on them and had us pair up with someone we didn't know. I wandered to the other side of the room, and "Jeff" and I agreed to be partners. We were supposed to spend 2 minutes on each question — things like "When was the first time you met someone of a different race?" Jeff was 19 yrs. old and talked about his challenges being a young, black man. We talked about experiencing fear of another person as well as having friends and colleagues of other races. We shared challenges and discovered things about ourselves. The forum also included discussions of equality, equity and discrimination. It was a lot to cover in two hours and I found myself wanting to talk further.

I'm glad I was there. The forum taught me the importance of listening, and it revealed things about myself that will hopefully help me to better love my neighbour.

RECIPE CORNER

Loaded Potato Casserole

Ingredients

4-5 small/medium red potatoes (~1-1.5 lbs), cut into cubes

2 pieces of bacon, cooked & crumbled or 1/4 cup bacon bits

1/4 cup prepared ranch dressing

1/4 cup sour cream

1 cup cheddar cheese, divided in 1/2

1 tbsp fresh or dried parsley

2 green onions, sliced

Instructions

Cut up potatoes, I like about 1" cube size, and boil them until tender---don't let them fall apart! As potatoes are cooking, cut up bacon pieces, fry, drain and set aside.

Preheat your oven to 350F.

Mix the ranch dressing, sour cream, 1/2 cup of the cheddar cheese, bacon, and parsley together. When potatoes are cooked, drain them, put them back in the pot and add in the ranch mixture and stir well to combine. Place potato mixture in a greased 8x8" (or similar size) casserole dish and top with the remaining 1/2 cup of cheese. Bake, uncovered, for about 30 minutes or until cheese is nice and bubbly.

Add slices of green onion on top and serve.
