






Clothing & Bedding Collection

DEACON'S REFLECTIONS

It's not hard to imagine the coming of Christmas when the first snow arrives before the store decorations — a first, isn't it? Each year, we remember God's gift of Jesus and I don't know about you, but that reminder gives me the nudge I need to be a little kinder and a bit more understanding. It's good to have a chance to start fresh.

Where is God inviting you in the love-your-neighbour-department? Maybe you'll volunteer at the Homeless Stand Down on January 11th. Some of us regularly help with community meals, nursing home worship, clothing and food collections — ask how to get involved.

Sometimes God's "ask" is harder. Bishop Hollingsworth has asked the diocese's deacons to work together on finding a way forward on the issue of gun violence. There are nine active deacons, including a gun owner, and none of us know what this path will look like. Today, several of us attended a talk given by the Rev. Sharon Risher, a Presbyterian priest. An African American, she spoke about her Momma, who made the best okra soup, loved the hymn, "One day at a time, sweet Jesus," and was killed by the shooter at Mother Emanuel AME Church in Charleston, SC in 2015. Despite that, the Rev. Risher's talk was full of hope and possibility.

I now find it helpful to remember the Christmas message: that God's love dwells with us and guides us, even if we're unsure and a little afraid of the next step.

RECIPE CORNER

Honey Garlic Roasted Carrots

Ingredients

- 2 pounds carrots cut into 3 inch pieces
- 1/2 cup butter
- 2 tbsp honey
- 4 garlic cloves minced
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp fresh ground pepper
- Fresh parsley

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees
- 2. In a oven safe skillet melt butter. Add in honey and garlic and whisk until combined.
- 3. Add in carrots and toss to coat.
- 4. Bake in oven for 25 minutes or until carrots are fork tender.
- 5. Optional- Broil for 3-4 minutes to caramelize the carrots a bit.
- 6. Sprinkle with chopped parsley.
