A: I will, with God's help.



RECIPE CORNER

Cake Mix Cookie Bars

Ingredients

- 1 (15 oz) box of yellow cake mix
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1/3 cup olive oil
- 12 oz bag of chocolate chips



INSTRUCTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
2. Beat eggs in a small bowl
3. Add cake mix and olive oil to the beaten eggs and mix well
4. Beat in chocolate chips (batter will be very thick)
5. Grease a 9 X 13 baking dish (see notes for thickness)
6. Spread batter evenly in the dish (this will take several minutes to spread evenly)
7. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 - 25 minutes, or until toothpick inserted comes out clean
8. Once cooled, cover or store in an airtight container
9. Enjoy!

Notes

The batter will be thick and hard to spread (this is normal) I found that using a rubber spatula and a spoon made it easier to spread into the pan. It may take a couple minutes, but it's so worth it! The thickness of the cookie bars will depend on how large of a baking dish you use.

PANERA MAC and CHEESE

Ingredients

- | | |

| 1 16-ounce Package package of rigati pasta | 6 Slices white American cheese, sliced into thin strips |
| 1/4 cup butter | 8 oz extra-sharp white Vermont cheddar, shredded |
| 1/4 cup all-purpose flour | 1/2 teaspoon Dijon mustard |
| 2 1/2 cup milk | 1 teaspoon kosher salt |
| 1/4 teaspoon hot sauce | |

Instructions

Prepare pasta according to package directions. In large saucepan over low heat, melt butter. Whisk in flour and cook 1 minute, whisking constantly. Gradually whisk in milk; cook over medium heat, whisking until mixture thickens and bubbles. Remove from heat. Add cheeses, mustard, salt, and hot sauce, stirring until cheese melts and sauce is smooth. Stir in pasta and cook over medium heat for 1 minute (or until thoroughly heated). Serve immediately.
