Public Service Announcement: *Free women's Self Defense Classes*

The Summit County Prosecutors Office is offering free self defense classes each month in various communities around the county and *They are free!*

All you need to do is show up, sign in and they will give you a large number of self defense situations that you should be able to/or can help yourself out of a situation. The class is taught by a certified instructor and Sherrie Bevan Walsh was present, talked about the course and of her personal experiences. There were about 20 people at Nordonia High School in the class near the end of August that I took part in and the ages ranged from high school to us elderly people, some of whom had replacement pieces and parts that prevented them from doing some defense moves but there were enough other moves to make up for it.

I do know they will be in Copley in September or October but if you are interested, go on line to the prosecutor's web site to find out more. Anyone that takes the class is welcome to attend another class to gain more practice on the moves that are taught.

There will be a number of packets of papers with instructions on the various moves for self-defense on the information table at the foot of the stairs.

The class takes about two hours to get all the points across and is well worth the time and effort.

ECW's 9th Annual Nut Sale

October will soon be here and it is time once again to order your nuts. (No snickers, please.) We're gearing up for this fund raiser in the same manner as before but with just a few reminders:

Price : *At the time of the Tiding's printing, the nuts will sell for \$9.50 per pound.* Please be aware that the price you pay may change due to the cost to us from the nut company. Any outside orders that are prepaid will sell at \$9.50.*

Forms: For the most part it's business as usual. An In-house order sheet will be on the table during October. A form for outside orders is on a clipboard at the foot of the stairs, along with flyers to be placed wherever you think they might be helpful beginning Oct. 1.

Cut off date for ordering is November 1.

The repackaging crew will do it's job and all orders will/should be ready before Thanksgiving.

Payment : All nuts whether individual packages or outside orders are to be paid for before they leave the church. If you are taking orders outside the parish be sure to have them pre-paid. Payment of orders from outside the church will be held, and not deposited, until the orders are delivered.

Ordering changes!

1. Once again ***We will not*** be selling unsalted cashews.

2. You will need to know your total needs when you order and one change is on the ordering sheet. ***Please print numbers very clearly and only indicate if you want the Lightly Salted nuts with a capital "L". An example is at the top of the sheet.*** This will help us from having to contact you about your order.

This will be our only order and our order to the nut company will be based on the totals on the sign-up sheet. Any remaining nuts will be on a first come first serve basis. Due to lack of sales during the last few cookie sales the nuts will not be available during the sale .

Help: is needed to sell nuts before, after, and between the services—still a problem area and the response in the past has been far from favorable so if you see the nuts/cashbox unattended please feel free to help out for that particular service, whether before or after the services. Instructions for putting away the nuts and the cash box are posted on the cash box.

Our repackaging crew has indicated that they enjoy the event and if anyone else is interested I can put your name on a reserve list.

The nuts do make terrific “hostess” gifts for the holiday gatherings, or your “what will you bring” item –the best part is-- you don’t have to prepare it. Other gift ideas -- the random “thank yous” could be for postal worker, hairdressers, and so on. They may appreciate that instead of Whitman’s Sampler box of candy. And of course, don’t forget the self-indulgence.

*In reference to the price, we try to keep it reasonable and many buyers were happy that our prices didn’t change last year. Of course we were excited to see the prices enabled us to make up some of the previous year’s ECW’s profit.

DEACON'S REFLECTIONS

“Jesus called his disciples and chose twelve of them...” In Luke’s gospel, the number of Jesus’ followers has been steadily growing, as he heals and teaches. He looks at that big crowd of disciples and singles out twelve for leadership roles. We’ve heard it a million times, right? Earlier this week I found myself asking: What about the ones who weren’t picked? Are they less loyal or faithful? Did they turn away from Jesus? No; according to Luke, the disciples who weren’t chosen continued to follow Jesus. The crowd travelled with him as he taught, hearing *“Love your enemies... Do not judge... Forgive.”* These un-chosen disciples witnessed Jesus’ compassion and care for those who were suffering – as he healed a centurion’s slave; as he raised a widow’s son, keeping her from destitution; and as he cast a legion of demons out of a man whose affliction made him homeless. The crowd of disciples learned the importance of accepting an outcast when a woman with hemorrhages snuck in, touched Jesus and was healed. Despite not being “the twelve”, the crowd of disciples were followers, learning Jesus’ way, so that one day they’d continue his work. We’re those disciples, too. Because it takes more than twelve to love and heal and care for God’s people.

RECIPE CORNER

CREAMY CRESCENT CHICKEN BAKE

Ingredients

- 1 can of crescent rolls 8 count regular
- 2 cups chopped cooked chicken
- 3 oz cream cheese softened
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 can cream of chicken soup
- 1 can of milk or half and half using soup can
- black pepper to taste



Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
2. Prepare soup, using milk instead of water, and set aside.
3. Mix cream cheese, chicken and cheese in a bowl
4. Separate crescent rolls. Spoon chicken mixture into each crescent; roll and seal to enclose filling.
5. Place in a 9×13 baking dish. Pour soup in baking dish allowing just a bit to go over rolls.
6. Bake uncovered for 35 mins.
