### ECW Christmas Cookie Sale, December 14, 2019

I volunteered to be the co-chair of Christmas Cookie Sale again this year after picking it up at the last-minute last year due to the move of Marcy, the existing Chair. I was helped this year by the new co-chaired Lillian DeMattia and the generous help of Cheryl McDonald, Suzanne Palmer, and Mara DeMattia. We split the planning, purchasing, and other duties between us.

We were able to get together via meetings, email, text, and phone calls to coordinate the event. We met the deadlines to get the write-up in the tidings, bulletin inserts, and the flyers were posted. We continued with print advertising, also posting it on Facebook and the website. We were able to make announcements for several weeks prior to the event during the church services. As with other events, we should have a checklist for the timing of steps needed in the process. This is something I will create for next year.

We planned for more sales than last year and the initial hit as we opened. I was helped by Anja and Zoie to set up the tables on Thursday, which worked out well. We added additional tables in the Sunday School room and had both rooms set up with prepackaged and some mix and match options. The extra space was a great idea as the cookies were spread out and people were able to move around easier. I put on Christmas music to play during the sale and it added to the atmosphere.

The overall event was well received, and the total was \$2112. The cost of supplies was around \$175, and advertising was around \$485. We had over 430 dozen (or equivalent) cookies made by over two dozen people. Presales totaled \$330, sales day totaled \$1549.50, and follow-up sales totaled \$232.50. We only had 16 dozen leftovers.

We had nuts and jewelry out for sale and those were handled separately from the cookie sale.

## **ECW** CONTINUED

### **Supplies needed/purchased:**

We purchased additional bulk containers, large bags, small bags, clear containers, and labels. The remaining containers and bags will be set aside for use next year. We had plenty of t-shirt bags to pack up the cookies and that worked perfect with the size of the containers.

We used cloth tablecloths from my house and borrowed from friends. It was mentioned that there are cloth white tablecloths in the shed that were used in the past. We can utilize this for next year as well as for Mother's Day. We can use runners, placemats, and other items to add color to the tables.

The banners were updated, and the cost was covered by Cheryl. They were put up after Thanksgiving, but the soil was too mushy to hold them up correctly. We should put those posts up and not remove them.

### **Comments/Suggestions:**

The weather was rainy then light snow, but that didn't seem to stop people coming out. Within the first hour was the bulk of the sales. We could use additional check-out people and helpers for that first hour next year. I had to create several of the documents that we used for posters and instructions. Those documents will be uploaded to the website so we can reuse them next year.

Because of some samples being placed out, we had an issue with people initially sampling the mix and match cookies. This was a problem until the boxes were moved to the back and we had people moving around explaining. Suggestions for next year is to either not have any samples or to have the mix and match in a predefined location with someone doing the boxing. I like the latter idea and think that having a table for mix and match would be a good focal point.

We also had an issue with dropped cookies. We should plan for more boxes or baskets for people to use when selecting cookies. We could also use more helpers walking around with people.

People asked for Buckeyes and we didn't have any of the regular ones to sell. We had plenty of lemon and they went fast again this year. Someone suggested having a section for candy and getting more people to make that.

For leftovers, we didn't have that many this year. What we did have are in the freezer to use at the annual meeting or some other event.

Overall, it was a great event and I am glad I did this again. We had a whole lot of fun putting it together. I really hope that next year the weather will cooperate!

We really want to thank everyone who jumped in to help. Whether it was bringing in items, advice, setup, or cleanup, people were great!

## RECIPE CORNER

### Philly Cheesesteak Sloppy Joes



#### INGREDIENTS:

- 1 pound lean ground beef
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 small yellow onion, diced
- 1 small green bell pepper, diced
- 8 ounces brown mushrooms minced
- 2 tablespoons ketchup
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon Kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon fresh ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- 1 cup beef broth
- 8 ounces Provolone Cheese Slices, chopped (use 6oz if you don't want it very cheesy)
- 6 brioche hamburger buns

#### DIRECTIONS:

1. Add the ground beef to a large cast iron skillet (this browns very well) and brown until a deep brown crust appears before breaking the beef apart.
2. Stir the ground beef and brown until a deep crust appears on about 50 or so percent of the beef.
3. Remove the beef (you can leave the fat) and add the butter and the onions and bell peppers and mushrooms.
4. Let brown for 1-2 minutes before stirring, then let brown for another 1-2 minutes before stirring again


